MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

As I look back over the last 26 years, I continue to be inspired by how far our community has come. We have seen the Sikh American voice elevated in the halls of Congress with increasing influence year after year.

This past year, I was pleased to work with over 70 dynamic young leaders through our SikhLEAD internship program. These young leaders were able to get exposure to some of the highest levels of government and a firsthand look at the legislative process. Many of these young leaders were instrumental in the success of our SikhVOTE program, conducting outreach to over I00,000 Sikh voter contacts. This was the largest mobilization since SikhVOTE was launched a decade ago.

2022 also marked the 10th Anniversary of the Oak Creek mass shooting. The Remembrance event, which SALDEF supported, became a national model for what successful interfaith and government collaboration can look like after tragedy.

Additionally, this past year, among growing safety concerns toward houses of worship, I was appointed Chair of the Department of Homeland Security's Faith Based Security Advisory Council (FBSAC). As the first Sikh American to serve as Chair and only Sikh American on the 25 member Council, this appointment ensures the Sikh voice is at the table as we tackle some of the most pressing and challenging safety concerns of our time.

We could not do this important work without our incredible network of supporters. Thank you to our partners, staff, donors and volunteers for helping to make this possible.

MOVING FORWARD TOGETHER

Training TSA Officers on Screening Sikh Travellers

SALDEF is grateful to be awarded the Multicultural Coalition Partnership Award by the Transportation Security Administration (TSA). The award recognizes SALDEF's decade-long partnership with the TSA along with our significant work on developing an educational online training titled "Effective Engagement and Screening of Sikh Travelers and their Religious Items". This impactful training is aimed at raising awareness of Sikhi to TSA officers nationwide and providing a clear understanding of how to respectfully engage with Sikh travelers and the Sikh articles of faith.


ADVOCATING AT THE WHITE HOUSE AGAINST HATE

SALDEF Executive Director Kiran Kaur Gill met with President Biden, Vice President Harris, and other national leaders at the White House multiple times throughout this year to share strategies to counter hate and violent extremism that threatens minority and marginalized communities. She presented and shared recommendations with the Commissioners of the White House Initiative on Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians, and Pacific Islanders about the connection between gun violence, mass shootings, and racism.



STRENGTHENING OUR DEMOCRACY





At SALDEF, we believe that language accessibility is something that doesn't need to be another barrier in the voting process. We collaborated with JusPunjabi TV to reach Punjabi-speaking voters. We began to work





with local and rural communities around the country to mobilize and create awareness around the lack of Punjabi voting materials in areas that needed them the most. As a result of our partnerships and advocacy, SALDEF mobilized over 100,000 Sikh American voters across the nation.

Phone-banking, social media engagement and in person community outreach have all been tools in our efforts to ensure accessible voting for all Sikh Americans.

TURNING TRAGEDY INTO UNITY



Remembering Oak Creek Victims at 10th Anniversary

On August 5, 2022, we commemorated the ten year anniversary of the mass shooting at the Sikh Temple of Wisconsin in Oak Creek, which resulted in the death of seven members of the sangat. To ensure that we never forget the tragedy at Oak Creek, SALDEF organized a remembrance event in coordination with affected community members and partner organizations. Together we came together to heal, reflect, and take action.

 SALDEF staff members conducted gurdwara tours for interfaith residents of Oak Creek to help them understand the role of the gurdwara in Sikhi.

- Concurrently, SALDEF hosted a series of workshops featuring partner organizations and SikhLEAD program alumni such as "youth mobilization" led by SikhLEAD alumna Tarina Ahuja.
- Along with the commemoration events, SALDEF hosted a panel featuring Sikh youth of Oak Creek, Wisconsin, as they discussed their vision for the Sikh American community, their path to advocacy and the support they received from community members in the aftermath of the shooting.

In response to the tragedy of the Oak Creek shooting, SALDEF also released a whitepaper, "Taking on Hate & White Supremacy: Policy Recommendations Ten Years after the Attacks in Oak Creek, Wisconsin" to offer concrete policy solutions to better protect our community and others who may be facing similar challenges.

SALDEF continues to actively work to empower our community to get

engaged and advocate for policies to use the lessons from Oak Creek to prevent acts of hate, build united communities, and support those who are impacted by tragedy.



UNITING AGAINST HATE

The nearly 3,800 reports of incidents targeting the Asian American community over the past year are a challenge to the conscience of the country. On June 25, 2022, SALDEF collaborated with national Asian American organizations to march in Washington, D.C., alongside other marginalized communities to unite against hate.

With several thousand people in attendance, SALDEF highlighted key Sikh American agents of change across the United States, including J.J. Kapur from Iowa, Komal Chohan from Indianapolis, and Pardeep Kaleka from Wisconsin.

By highlighting the resilience of the Sikh American community, SALDEF offered the stories of our community as a lesson and inspiration for communities facing crisis. We shared a roadmap, underscored by our values, to fight hate and violence in communities across the country.







BUILDING LEADERSHIP CAPACITY FOR SIKH YOUTH

SikhLEAD is a national youth leadership development program that empowers students to unlock their potential. As a premier leadership program for Sikh youth, the power of the SikhLEAD program stems directly from its innovative approach grounding leadership principles in Sikhi, social justice, and civic engagement.

In 2022, 73 Sikh youth from across the nation interned in Congressional offices, at the White House, in the State Assembly and with federal agencies and partner organizations.

Participants in the DC-based federal SikhLEAD Internship Program gained hands- on experience in national-level policy and advocacy. To give back to their sangats, they launched the SikhCIVICS project, researching and writing on key policy issues from a Sikh lens. Along with developing professional and leadership skills, the DC interns were provided stipends of \$1500 to help defray housing and living costs.





With the support of our alumni, donors, and mentors, SALDEF promises to continue enhancing our flagship SikhLEAD program in the coming years to help our Sikh youth to develop leadership skills, encourage political and civic engagement, and foster interest in public service careers.

SALDEF's Initiative - Sikh American Health Survey


SALDEF's LDP team has produced the first ever Sikh American health survey that will provide key data we need to improve the health status of our sangat.






FINANCIALS: 2022 EXPENSES


